Minutes of the Annual General Meeting Wednesday 29th April 2009

1. Apologies

2. **Minutes of the last A.G.M.** – The minutes were signed as correct.

3. **Matters arising** - There were no matters arising.

4. Reports

a) President – Rachael Fell

I'm sure it came as much as a surprise to you all just as it did to me to be honoured with the title of President this year. When John Clewes first called I presumed he'd had one too many of Bob's fine ales but I soon realised he was deadly serious. When asked what it entailed, John replied not much work but you'll have to buy lots of beer. I have had a fantastic year both on the pitch and off the pitch. There has been 3 historical moments in the clubs history this year and I am proud to have been involved in all of these as well as many of you here tonight. I'm sure Geoff will be reviewing the achievements of this season in his report but the 2 I would like to mention to start with is Clubs First. It was a huge landmark to gain the status as a Sport England Clubs First accredited club and one that we all should be proud of. As with all achievements and inspections standards have to be maintained and we must continue to abide by the Clubs First standards and ensure the club remains a happy and safe place for U18's to participate in quality coaching and play hockey.

Secondly, I cannot end my presidential year without congratulating the ladies 1st team on winning the double and taking the ladies to a league where we have never gone before. Congratulations to all the team and especially to our Club Personality of the Year, Paul Sibley, for dealing with the PMT, nagging and explicit ladies chat twice a week.

On that note, I would also like to thank everyone who has played there part in making this year a huge success including all coaches, captains, umpires and the committee members who do the hard work behind the scenes to ensure the club remains a fantastic place to socialise and play hockey.

b) Chairman – Geoff Bail

This season has been an eventful one for the Club on and off the pitch, and I think that it is worth reviewing the key events here:

COMBINED AGM – I am sure that the combined AGM has helped forge a stronger tie within the Club, and, with the excellent Presidential year that Rachael has had, we now have a much more homogenous Club, the fruits of this will be noticed in various registry offices and Churches during the Summer.

CLUB PLAYING HEALTH CHECK - There is no doubt that we have had a tough year on the field – from the heady heights of the Ladies 1st team winning both promotion and the Cup, to relegation of the 5th and 6th Mens and 4th team ladies, we will have a number of challenges ahead. What is apparent though is the grit and determination that all our teams have shown this season, a real fighting spirit which has meant that despite our problems results wise we never give up. I am sure that the new developments will attract new members during the Summer, and that we will continue to strive for the best standard of hockey .

CLUB GENERAL HEALTH CHECK - I don't know if it is just me, but I have noticed a real buzz about the Club this season. The really important things that have happened for me are:

1. Meeting the Head of the School last year and coming away with a fast track proposal to lay the new pitch this Spring – we were expecting another 2 years at least with the old pitch.
2. Going to the Members with a no-nonsense fund raising proposal which proved to be a great success, thanks to Martin for the idea and to Nick Hemm for his inspired marketing campaign (and the Schools colour copier!).
3. The award of ClubsFirst – a presentation by Zoe Rogers to President Rachael Fell on a cold Sunday morning was inspiring.
4. A chance meeting with the Rushcliffe Sports Development Team will hopefully lead to funding for us to develop hockey training with the local feeder Primary schools starting in September.
5. A brilliant season as President by Rachael who has really helped bring the Club together.

SOCIAL EVENTS - Another good year with record bar profits? – all the usual activities were evident, but we will be looking at ringing the changes next season so any ideas please. Thanks to Liz and Andy for another seasons hard work, probably one of the hardest Club posts to have.

TOURNAMENT - Great weather, for a change, a slimmed down tournament just about summed up the Club this season, great hockey, great people, good food and drink and a brilliant atmosphere. Nobody does it better.

PITCH DEVELOPMENTS - As the bulldozers move in we need to reflect on how we got it and where it will take us. Martin has been instrumental in pushing the project forward this year, both in leading the School expertly towards what we wanted, and in raising the money that we needed to fulfil our part of the deal. Club members put their money where their hearts were to raise over £16,000 by Christmas, as we had to prove to the School that we had the funds. Thanks to everyone who contributed. Martin then organised a series of grants totalling in excess of £45,000 which means that we have the funds needed

without having to draw on our reserves. The new dugouts have been a great transitional addition, the new spectator area seeming to open up the pitch making it feel larger and more friendly. With the new surface we will have an excellent facility. The new pitch will no doubt attract new players to the Club. We should encourage this as we always have selection problems during the season, and need a larger pool of players. We are an inclusive hockey Club who believe that the sport is for players of all abilities, if you want to play hockey then that is what we are about.

IN CONCLUSION - It is important that we continue to remind ourselves of why the Club has been successful and that we cannot be complacent about the future. Support for youth training on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings is fundamental to our future, as is a continued willingness to get involved in the support activities, without which we wouldn't have a game to play, umpiring – someone, in fact two people have to do it, working on the bar, providing hospitality for the opposition, keeping the clubhouse and pitch tidy and supporting your captain wherever possible, and helping to organise and support social events, are all a part of club life which is often forgotten about – please get involved, offer to help - it is your club.

Special mention must be made about Bobs work as chair of mens selection for over 21 years. He is standing down next season, so I would like to thank him for all his wisdom and knowledge, which has meant more to the Club than we can quantify.

c) Treasurer - James Cashmore

Accounts for the season were presented to the meeting showing the continuing success of Club.

- 1) Bar takings were very slightly ahead of last year but still set a new record although price of pint has gone up
- 2) Kit for re-sale down as did not have to give out many of the new shirts
- 3) Debtors £18,595 as we have paid some money upfront to School re pitch
- 4) Better Insurance Policy obtained at very slightly higher premium
- 5) Utility prices have gone up in general
- 6) Interest on accounts has fallen due to rates
- 7) Dug-out costs being depreciated over 3 years
- 8) Still adding £3,200 to sinking fund
- 9) Pitch costs in accounts. Costs less grants/donations so net cost to Club is £6,221

On behalf of the Committee, James proposed that annual subs remain at £60, seconded Mark Carroll. Carried.

d) Social Secretary – Andy McCarroll

There were the usual selection of social events through the season. The end of season dinner dance was held at the Albert Hall again, and ran smoothly, although a small loss was made with approx 120 attending. There were two curry and quizzes, which were as successful as ever, so thanks to Coops and Geoff, plus the team of helpers. The race night at the start of the season was financially successful, partly due to the generous sponsorship of a number of local businesses, although given the good feedback and enthusiasm after the previous years race night, the attendance was not as good as had been hoped. For the second year, there was a written quiz at Christmas, which seemed to do its job and keep a few people entertained and in the bar for a while. Any suggestions for possible events next year would be gratefully received and considered. Of course, the main social aspect of the club is not the events but the atmosphere generated around the club, and for that we can thank everyone, especially, of course, Derek for running such a good bar, which received due recognition this season.

This was yet again another difficult season with the league containing 3 university sides, Cannock, 2 Beeston teams and our very own 5ths. The league has been very competitive with teams taking points off each other, typified by Edgbaston some how beating Birmingham University twice. The early front runners and last year's league champion Beeston 4s faded away due to player issues and rallied towards the end of the season to retain their league status. The title was contested by Birmingham Uni and Cannock who ended up running out league champions.

After Christmas things became slightly harder with the likes of Sutton Coldfield and Stourport doing their level best to stay in the league by any means possible. Stourport bolstered their team and even felt it necessary to bring an umpire under false pretences to both of their away matches at Bridgford. After gaining promotion last season we have performed a first for the Club, a season without a victory. You would be forgiven for interpreting this as a disastrous season for the players, with Saturday after Saturday of doom and gloom, BUT quite the opposite occurred. 7) Development – Martin Ebsworth

CLUBHOUSE - Generally, everything is ok, although have had a couple of problems with roller shutters. Need to start thinking about re-decorating, new carpet, over the next couple of years

RUSHCLIFFE PITCH- We are continuing to put pressure on Parkwood Leisure and Rushcliffe BC to do something about the goals, pitch and general un-tidyness and they are in middle of audit of all-weather pitches in the Borough. There is a new manager at the Centre, who is on our side but main problem is that School use pitch as an unsupervised playground.

DUG-OUTS - At the start of the season, as promised, we installed dug-outs and a spectator area at the pitch. I think it was well appreciated by players, opposition, umpires and spectators and made the pitch look a lot wider and a lot safer. It cost the Club £8,000 and we received a £1,500 grant from East Midlands Airport. Thanks to all those members who came down to help put them together

PITCH - Great News. Works to the pitch started on Monday and are due to finish 17 July

The School, following receipt of 4 tenders, and with full agreement of WBMHC Committee has appointed Charles Lawrence as the contractor for new shockpad, re-carpet and extension of the all weather pitch with inlaid lines at a total cost of £176,957, which, includes at WBMHC request, an extra £30,000 for upgrade of surface to sand-dressed. This will increase the length of

the pitch at tree end by 8.1m (no goal recess) to provide a pitch of 91.4m x 55m. (EHL/FIH size) This will increase run-offs at either end to 4m (currently 2.75m) but will NOT increase the width run-offs as this would require floodlights to be moved
